Be that as it may, Weinstein is being used as the scapegoat to pay for all the "sins" of a system of female denial and degradation that is based on "tradition, reason, and acceptance" (Karenga, 1967). All men are in on it on some level. Women have been accepting it claiming that there was nothing they could do. In the case of white women, their situation is different in my view: this was their man committing these atrocities. Many of the men committing these acts were married to white women who had to know what their man was capable of. back, Fourth and finally, "How Women Get Laid and Paid."
