frequently employed in international propaganda
to denounce and discredit an opponent s foreign
policy the term imperialism was originally
introduced into english in its present sense in
the late 1870s by opponents of the allegedly
aggressive and ostentatious imperial policies of
british prime minister benjamin disraeli

supporters of imperialism such as Joseph Chamberlain quickly appropriated the concept for some imperialism designated a policy of idealism and philanthropy others alleged that it was characterized by political self interest and a growing number the meaning of imperialism is the policy practice or advocacy of extending the power and dominion of a nation especially by direct territorial acquisitions or by gaining indirect control over the political or economic life of other areas broadly the extension or imposition of power authority or influence how to use imperialism in a sentence mar 2 2022 imperialism is the expansion of a nation's authority over other nations through the acquisition of land and or the imposition of economic and political domination the age of imperialism is typified by the colonization of the americas between the 15th and 19th centuries as well as the expansion of the united states japan and the european powers during the late 19th and early 20th century imperialism state policy practice or advocacy of extending power and dominion especially by direct territorial acquisition or by gaining political and economic control of other areas in ancient times rulers in china western asia and the mediterranean social change imperialism see all related content cultural imperialism in anthropology sociology and ethics the imposition by one usually politically or economically dominant community of various aspects of its own culture onto another

nondominant community it is cultural in that the customs traditions religion language social and moral norms and other aspects of the imposing community are distinct from though often closely related to the imperialism is the domination of one people by another imperialism is found in the ancient histories of china india the middle east egypt africa and american indian societies west europe was shaped by the roman empire from which many of its laws and customs are derived 1 a policy or practice by which a country increases its power by gaining control over other areas of the world british imperialism created the enormous british empire 2 the effect that a powerful country or group of countries has in changing or influencing the way people live in other poorer countries imperialism
